Informal teaching

Relations – Kinship Circle

- Wakanyeja (sacred being/child)
- Tiwahe, Tiospaye, Oyate (family, extended family, nation)

Doing – Family & Community

- Wowacinye (accountable/responsible to a role & purpose)
- Wacantohnaka (generosity)



Formal Teaching

Ceremony

- Honor, recognize, celebrate, pray, heal
- Coming together as relatives

Storytelling

- Wico'oyake – history, narratives, stories
- Hitunkankapi – tales, legends, myths

- Government funded & Church run schools
- Forced Assimilation
- 1860-1960

- Termination
- 1953 Public Law 280
- 1956 Indian Relocation Act
- 1957 Termination 100+ Tribes

- 1968 Indian Civil Rights Act
- 1969 A National Tragedy, A National Challenge Senate Report
- 1972 Indian Education Act
- 1975 Indian Self-Determination & Education Assistance Act
- 1978 Indian Religious Freedom Act
- 1978 Indian Child Welfare Act
- 1990 Native American Languages Act

- 132/187 Tribally Controlled - Bureau of Indian Education Schools
